NASPAG Remembers Leah Harrison by Liz Alderman, M.D.

You may have attended a workshop at the Annual Clinical Meeting on the Evaluation of a Child for Abuse or have had dinner with her or had been lucky enough to work with her on a national committee...whatever your contact with Leah Harrison, RN, MSN, CPNP, you know she was an unforgettable person. On Monday, November 25, 2002, Leah Harrison died at the age of 55 from complications of acute myelogenous leukemia.

Leah was the founder of the child-protection program at the Children's Hospital at Montefiore as well as its associate director. Many a medical student, pediatric resident and pediatrician could say that he or she was taught by Leah. But more importantly, many providers were inspired by Leah's compassion and her advocacy for the children under her care. The Leah Harrison Educational Center for Child Protection at Montefiore was named in her honor.

Leah joined NASPAG in 1998 and that same year led a workshop, Evaluation of the Sexually Abused Girl, with David Muram. Subsequently, as an active member of NASPAG, Leah was a workshop leader at many an annual clinical meeting. These workshops ranged from evaluation of the sexually abused child, how to testify in court and interviewing techniques for the medical provider.

Leah was a national leader and expert in the evaluation of child abuse and was consulted in the development of other child protection programs. She had an international presence, working with leaders in Israel, Jordan and other countries to set up pilot child protection programs. Her dynamic personality was infectious; she will be missed.
