Request for Applications

The NASPAG Research Network (NRN) Committee is pleased to announce that NASPAG is offering a grant award to support an NRN project. Any **current NRN member with an active or recently submitted project** is encouraged to apply for the grant. <https://www.naspag.org/naspag-research-network>. The purpose of the grant is to enhance multi-institutional, collaborative pediatric and adolescent gynecology research.

One \$2,400 grant will be awarded. Applicants may apply to other NASPAG grants but may only receive one award.

Eligibility to Apply:

- A current general member of the NRN (complete this form to sign up, all NASPAG members are welcome and encouraged to join <https://forms.gle/VGZEu1wdyT6A2tgE9>)
- Applicants do not need to be current fellows/residents, but preference will be given to those applicants in-training or within-in 2 years of training.
- Applicants must be a NASPAG member

Application Contents:

1. Study proposal
 - a. Page 1. Title page (institution, PI, study team)
 - i. Institutional address and fiscal authority contact (may be department financial administrator or Office of Grants and Contracts) for funds to be distributed to. The funds cannot be distributed to you directly. For your institution's knowledge, NASPAG uses bill.com for all of their payments
 - b. Page 2. Specific aims (1 page)
 - c. Research strategy (maximum 3 pages)
 - i. A. Significance
 - ii. B. Innovation
 - iii. C. Approach (study design, methods, statistical analysis, expected outcomes, potential problems and alternative strategies, planned timeline)

- iv. D. Future directions (impact on clinical care or how the data will be utilized)
 - d. Project milestones Checklist
 - i. IRB submission? Yes/No
 - ii. Reviewed study design with a statistician? Yes/No/Not Applicable
 - iii. Patient recruitment started? Yes/No/Not Applicable
 - iv. Developed data collection form? Yes/No
 - v. Data collection started/completed? Yes/No
2. Budget request and budget justification
 - a. Eligible budget items: direct costs related to supplies, participant remuneration, statistical support, equipment, travel to present project, publication costs
 - b. Restricted budget items: salary support for PI or mentor, indirect costs
3. Current NIH biosketch
 - a. In narrative, please include how receiving this grant would help achieve short- and long-term career goals.
4. Mentor letter of support (may be from department chair if out of training) ensuring adequate support and resources
5. NRN approval letter. **If your study is not yet approved, it must be submitted to the NRN Steering Committee by October 7, 2026** to allow time for Committee review in order to be considered for the NRN Grant.

Selected awardees will be expected to provide:

- Proof of IRB approval of project
- Progress reports to the NRN Committee every 6 months via nrn@naspag.org.
 1. Current status of the project and an updated timeline
 2. Budget update include invoice of how money was used
- Final report anticipated 2 year after receipt of grant
 - No-cost extensions may be considered on a case by case basis
- Expected to submit for presentation at an upcoming NASPAG ACRM within three years of receiving the award. If accepted for presentation, conference registration fees will be waived. However, receipt of an award does not guarantee acceptance of an oral or poster presentation.

This application is due on **October 16, 2026**.
